Are you a clinician with a passion for improving clinical practice and care for people with kidney disease?

The role:

We are looking for someone to invest half a day a week to lead and role-model exceptional quality improvement across a broad geographical area, working within the KQuIP framework with quality improvement facilitators.

Priorities will range from developing a QI education package, ensuring consistent governance, effective use of data, and building a strong QI network.

The person:

You must be a UKKA member from any professional group with established and demonstrable knowledge and experience in quality improvement – preferably with a QI qualification.

Other skills we are looking for include:

- Project management
- Knowledge of kidney care pathways
- Data interpretation
- Establishing and nurturing effective networks and relationships

Although initially created as a single clinical lead, we are working to ensure that as the programme grows further leadership roles will be created.

KQuIP:

KQuIP was set up in 2017 to support kidney healthcare professionals to introduce systematic Quality Improvement (QI) into everyday clinical practice. The overall aim of KQuIP is to facilitate the improvement of outcomes and reduce unwarranted variation in the quality of care for patients with kidney disease.
