NephroS Study Update

The Steroid Resistant Nephrotic Syndrome (SRNS) Study has recently expanded to include Steroid Sensitive Nephrotic Syndrome (SSNS) patients. This amendment also allows for the collection of blood samples at times of relapse and remission.

A further amendment will shortly be submitted to allow for the collection of saliva rather than blood samples from relatives in order to confirm genetic results.
