UKRAINE CRISIS – THE BAPN RESPONSE

Statement of support – Please see the latest <u>UKKA statement and</u> support for Ukraine published on 27/4/2022

Dialysis – there are approximately 40 children in Ukraine on dialysis, some of which are now receiving care in Poland and other neighbouring countries. We are closely monitoring our UK dialysis capacity and have made representations at the RCPCH Specialty Board that BAPN centres are ready to offer dialysis to evacuees on renal replacement therapy if needed. Please may dialysis centres confirm capacity and willingness to accept dialysis patients in principle to nabil.melhem@gstt.nhs.uk

Expertise – we have been making enquiries about offering remote advice for children with kidney disease. If this is practical and needed, we will be looking for volunteers to offer their time to assist with this. We are also approaching other allied multiprofessional groups including nurses, dietitians and pharmacists to ask if they would assist in offering advice if asked.

Donations - The Disasters Emergency Committee, a coalition of 15 leading UK charities, has launched <u>its collective appeal to provide</u> <u>emergency aid and rapid relief to civilians suffering during the</u> <u>conflict</u>. CLINICAL IMPACT AWARDS

The clinical excellence awards (CEA) have now been replaced by the new Clinical Impact Awards (CIA) which was introduced this year. The advisory committee for clinical impact awards (ACCIA) has now replaced the formally named ACCEA.

Local Awards (LEA) will not change for people around the country, with level 9 LEA sitting just below the £40k award. National level awards will be £20, £30 & £40k for levels N1, N2 & N3 respectively. There is also an N0 award in Wales worth £10k.

CLINICAL NEWS

ALTAPLASE SHORTAGE

Colleagues have raised the issue of a national shortage in Alteplase, particularly 2mg vials used for smaller lines in paediatric patients before starting dialysis and as a line lock between dialysis sessions. The UKKA Kidney Patient Safety Committee is aware and has raised this with DHSC. If your unit has been affected, or has implemented alternative practice, we'd be grateful if you could please let us know by emailing renal@renal.org.

COVID TREATMENT

Sotrovimab is a MAB therapy that is being advised by NHS England and NHS Improvement in those with COVID, 12 years of age and older and >40kg in high risk groups, which includes some of our patient groups. It is for use in mild – moderate COVID in the community to prevent hospitalisation and for those with COVID symptoms severe enough to need hospitalisation. NHS England will be contacting people they think are eligible. The treatment has been shown to be safe and effective in over 18 year olds.

Currently we would advise an individual risk / benefit discussion with any eligible patients as the incidence of serious illness with COVID is much lower in children and young people.
