Clinical Research Fellow (clinically qualified and registered, e.g. NMC, GMC, HPCP)

The UK Renal Registry has an opportunity for a clinician in renal medicine to undertake a two-year placement (either as a secondment or fixed term contract)

Hours:	4 days per week, flexible working (if currently working full time, it may be possible to continue working clinically for one day per week, with the agreement of your Trust)
Salary:	Seconded-current basic salary or £48,000 (pro rata £38,500)
Contract:	2 years fixed term or secondment
Location:	Bristol with remote working

The UK Renal Registry is the part of the UK Kidney Association responsible for the collection, analysis, management and development of a high quality clinical renal database. We use data submitted from the 71 adult and 13 paediatric renal centres across the country to create the database. The information, in the form of data and reports, is a shared resource used to improve the quality of care for renal patients and to carry out research into advanced kidney disease.

The opportunity:

We are seeking a clinician experienced in kidney care to act as first point of contact for clinical data queries for UKRR colleagues, including statisticians and data managers. They will contribute to the core work of the UKRR including the writing of research papers, preparation of its CKD and AKI annual reports, whilst developing their own programme of work. The skills and experience obtained during this time will be invaluable for an applicant aiming to become a local quality assurance/audit lead in the future.

The postholder will undertake relevant and beneficial research during their time with the UKRR, which includes the option of the UKKA funding a relevant qualification, such as an MSc in epidemiology or public health.

The person:

- Qualified and registered clinician
- Experience and familiarity with UK hospital systems and practices
- Experience in delivering clinical care and knowledge of the full clinical kidney care pathway
- Experience in writing research papers and audit reports
- Understanding of epidemiology, data and basic statistics
- Applicants who are kidney doctors must be functioning at ST3 level or above and have, or be eligible for, GMC registration that allows you to work in posts that are not recognised for training.
